New Life Being Brought to Mount Wilson Observatory

Beginning on March 5, Mount Wilson Observatory will be hosting many scientists from all over the world to use the Hooker telescope in Pasadena, California. Scientists will be able to use the telescope, solar tower, and other materials for their experiments that require the bigger equipment Mount Wilson can supply. Mount Wilson Observatory is hoping to bring in donors to help in the funding of this program.

Mount Wilson Institute is a nonprofit, tax-exempt consortium of astronomers, educators, and private donors. The Institute is preparing the observatory for a 'rebirth' so that it can be used once again in the world of science. Hooker telescope was used by Edwin Hubble who discovered the basis for the Big Bang Theory. The telescope was closed for 8 years in the 1980s before it began its restoration. Scientist will now be able to use the 100-in Hooker telescope, 60-in telescope, 60-ft solar tower, and many other equipments. These telescopes have made history and hope they can make it again.

Mt. Wilson is seeking donors to help in the recovery of this fine observatory. The observatory is offering night tours with the scientist starting March 5th at 9pm. Everyone can request detailed science data sheets now or on the tour.
